Which courses can I study at my local college?

How many hours will I study at college each week?

The number of hours you will spend at college will depend on the course you choose to study and whether you study full-time or part-time.

Most full-time courses require you to spend only 6-15 hours a week at college. This could be a couple of days a week, or just a few evenings. This course structure allows you to work while you study.
