

## UNIVERSITY OF PLYMOUTH

Who can come on exchange? If you're a full-time student at any university around the world you can potentially come to study with us on exchange. Our undergraduate exchange takes place in Stage 2, so you'll need to have completed Stage 1 to apply.

Can I apply for Plymouth University accommodation? Once you've been accepted onto the course and have a Plymouth University ID number you can apply for [Plymouth University accommodation](#).

How do I get to Plymouth University? The [International Student Advisory Service](#) provides a pickup service from London airports for students starting in September. Once your application has been accepted we can send you information about this as it's released.

What are the Term dates? [Term dates, semesters and course dates at Plymouth University](#).

How many credits should I take? If you're here for the whole year, you'll take 120 of our credits (120 credits = 60 ECTS). If your exchange is for less than a year you'll need to discuss with your home institution how many credits you need to take.

I have a disability, can I still apply? Absolutely. We won't ever reject a student on the grounds of [disability](#). If you have a disability you're advised to put this on your application form, so we can make sure there's a support system in place for you to call on if you need it.

What are the English language requirements? As part of the application we'll ask you what [English qualifications](#) you have, assess if we're happy with your level of English, and check that you're suitable to join an exchange. If we feel you'd benefit from an English language course we'll be happy to send you all the information you need to enrol.

Do I have to pay tuition fees? No you don't pay tuition fees to Plymouth University. You'll need to discuss your tuition fees with your home institution.

Once I complete my studies at Plymouth University, when will I get my transcript? We hold our Assessment Panels and Boards in June every year and results are normally published in the first week of July. Transcripts will be sent to your home address. If you need the result before then we can supply a provisional certificate to your home institution.

What are the exchange application deadlines?

- 31 July for Term 1
- 31 October for Term 2
